Notification of Destruction of Will

Public Trustee

You can revoke your Will by destroying it.

If you do this, the Public Trustee suggests that **you**:

- burn your original Will or tear it up;
- burn or tear up all copies that you have;
- complete and sign the enclosed Notification of Destruction of Will form; and
- return the form in the reply paid envelope.

If you destroy your Will, it does not revive any earlier Will that you may have made. There can be problems if you die without a valid Will. You may wish to consider making a new one if you have not already done so.

Usually, if you make a valid new Will, it revokes any existing Will. If, however, the Public Trustee has not prepared the new Will, it cannot be sure of its legal effect.
